Touring Event run by East Ayrshire Car Club for the Monte Start Committee
Scotland

14 January 2017

There has been a very good response to the proposal of a run to practice navigational skills and to provide an opportunity for the driver and navigator to work together as a team before the Monte. It will also give an opportunity to 'shake down' your car before the big event. The event will take the form of an evening winter Tour and will use some of the excellent roads through the Arrochar Alps and the surrounding area. It is open to those who are doing the Historique and Classique and anyone else who wants to blow the cobwebs away at the start of the year. All are welcome.

1. Announcement:

The Col de Ruisg will be held on Saturday 14 January 2017 and is organised by the Monte Start Committee Scotland, run with the help of EACC.

. Signing on will take place in Luss at 6 pm and the Run will finish in Drymen. The first car will leave at 7pm. Full details of the Start and Finish venues will be sent out by email in the Final Instructions.

2. Jurisdiction:

The event will be held under the general rules of the MSA as a Touring Assembly, these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event. MSA Touring Assembly Permit 99520 has been issued. Held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations

3. Eligibility:

The event is open to all car enthusiasts.

4. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- a) Sporting cars of any age.
- b) Other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers.

5. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form.

The entry list closes on Monday 9 January 2017.

Refunds for withdrawn entries will be at the discretion of the organisers.

6. Documentation:

Pre event document inspection and signing on will take place at 6pm at Luss. The event will start at 7pm and you will be given your start time in the Final Instructions.

7. Signing on

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following, where required by law

- A valid MOT certificate.
- A valid Road Fund Licence
- A minimum of Third Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.
- Cars must comply with the MSA regulations for the event.

8. Route, Navigation and Driving Behaviour:

The route will be on public A and B class and unclassified roads and will all be on sealed surfaces. The route will be sent out prior to the event in a 'Monte style Itinerary'. This will allow navigators to plot the route on their map.

Participants must at all times comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, cyclists, walkers and livestock.

9. Entries:

The entry fee for the Touring Assembly is £15. This includes a rally plate, numbers and all necessary documents for the navigation, passage controls etc. The maximum number of entries is 30. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. **No email entries will be accepted. All entries must be on the official entry form, with the appropriate fee enclosed as a cheque or postal order. Cheques to be made out to 'Monte Start Committee Scotland'.**
