

ANNIVERSARY MONTE 100 TOURISTIQUE

As most of you will know by now, to mark the 100th anniversary of the first Glasgow Start of the Monte Carlo Rallye from Blythswood Square, there will be a very special Classic Car event, the Anniversary Monte 100 Touristique.

From Glasgow we shall drive to the Principality following in the tracks of the old Montes, taking in many of the famous Cols and Passes in the French Alps. Like the Montes of old the goal is to reach Monte Carlo in time for the party!



The Touristique will depart from Blythwood Square Gardens on the morning of Wednesday 31 January 2024, and follow the Rallye Monte Carlo Historique competitors to Dover, visiting their Passage Controls en route. For those living in the far south of England, there may be the opportunity for entrants to 'join in' with the Glasgow starters, if there is enough demand. After crossing the Channel there is an overnight halt in a charming chateau outside Calais.

On day 2, Thursday 1 February, setting out from Calais, we shall visit the scrutineering venue for the Reims starters and then carry on ahead of the Historiques to Langres for our second overnight halt. Day 3, Friday 2 February, our route takes us from Langres to Gap following traditional Monte roads. The next day, Saturday 3 February, we come down from the Alps to the warmth of the winter sunshine in Monte Carlo. In the evening a glittering black tie Gala Dinner and prize giving will be held in the Automobile Club de Monaco. The following day, Sunday 4 February, you will have an opportunity to take part in a traditional Mountain Circuit, finishing at the top of the Col de Turini in time for lunch. The event is open to pre-war cars from 1924 to 1939 and post war cars from 1948 to 1982. See you all in Glasgow.


